For the year 2009, FAPAC will award \$2,000 to each of the FIVE (5) scholarship winners during its 24<sup>th</sup> National Leadership Training Conference on May 11-15 2009 at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Houston, Texas. Scholarship winners are encouraged to attend the award ceremony. FAPAC does not provide any travel allowances.

**Eligibility Requirements:**

- Open to all Asian Pacific Americans, who are U. S. citizens or legal permanent residents of the United States.
- Enrolled in a U.S. accredited college or university as a degree seeking student. High school seniors are also encouraged to apply.
- Attained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Previous winners of FAPAC scholarships are not eligible.

**Selection Criteria:** Selection of FAPAC scholars will be based on applicant's skills abilities and academic and special achievements.

- Academic achievement
- Personal merit
- Leadership
